Why Attend

Based on **Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration regulations** (Part 49 Section 382), employers shall **require** a bus driver to submit to alcohol and/or controlled substance testing when the employer has a **reasonable suspicion** to believe that the driver has violated federal alcohol and/or controlled substance prohibitions. This section further requires that persons designated to determine "reasonable suspicion" **must receive a minimum of two (2) hours of training** in the "physical, behavioral, speech, and performance indicators of probable alcohol misuse and use of controlled substances".

This Reasonable Suspicion Training fulfills this federal requirement, and is also an excellent refresher.

- ✍ Prepare you to assess employee behavior in order to establish reasonable suspicion of drug or alcohol use.
- ✍ Outline the law and regulations associated with driver drug testing.
- ✍ Provide each participant with a certificate of Reasonable Suspicion Training.
